My name is Laura, I am part of the new Access and Triage Team here at Sight Concern Bedfordshire and I started with the organisation in March.

My role is to assess referrals that come into the organisation from Eye Clinics, Opticians, Selfreferrals and any others that come through.

As well as enquiries about our services, I call our clients to do a short assessment which helps to understand individual situations and highlight which services could be beneficial, be it a Low Vision Clinic appointment to find a magnifier, Social Group to be around others going through similar situations, or support from a Visual Impairment Advisor to support with concessions or disability benefit forms, which make finances easier.

People are kind enough to share their difficulties and worries and together we discuss services within Sight Concern Bedfordshire, as well as other local service providers who may be more suitable for other needs. It is incredibly rewarding being able to inform people about what is available for our clients and referring them to the support that they need through these calls.
